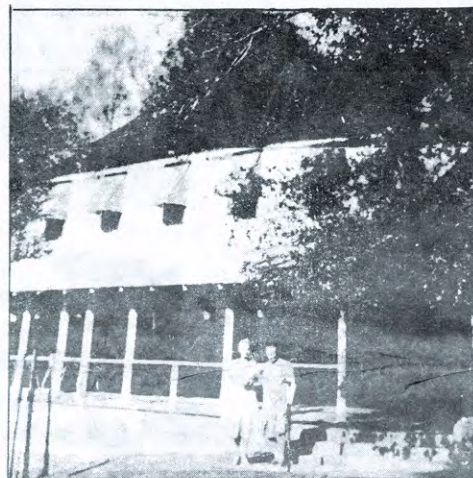

SAMUEL SPRINGS HOTEL in the 1940's. Pictured in front of the hotel are Irene Grigsby (left) and May Colman (right).

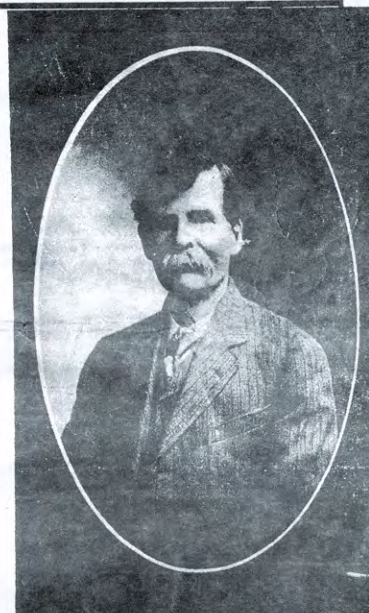
Samuel Springs

It was 1852. A man named Edmond Samuel and his wife Mary (Nee: Gregory) came by wagon train via Fort Laramie, and Salt Lake City, to California. They brought with them their three children, Neal Cornelius, Jane and Ange Samuel and settled in the Suisun Valley in Solano County.

Some twenty years later, Neal and his two brothers (born after the family settled in Calif.) Nataniel and George were deer hunting in the Berryessa Valley near the newly created town of Monticello. It was a hot day and they found a spring and got a drink. The joke between them was that Neal got the first drink and said that it tasted like poison. George and Nat said they would take a drink if Neal didn't die. They took samples from three springs in the area. One was soda water, one regular water and the other was mineral water.

Neal Cornelius Samuel took out squatters papers on the springs and named it Samuel Springs. In the 1880's it became a popular resort. The resort offered hot mineral baths, both soda and mineral water for drinking, a hotel and cabins. A small lake and fountain were built in front of the hotel. In May of 1888, the resort was sold to a family named Grigsby.

Today, the once beautiful vacation spot is in ruins. The property was last occupied during the early 1960's. by ~ Terry Pooler

Fishing at Spanish Flat

with - Ed Johnston

The best fishing is really turning on right now! Also, the catfishing is good in the coves. Trout and a few crappie are also starting to show.

The large mouth bass fishing is in a full pre-spawn mode. The large mouth are hitting in big coves, little coves, and some in the creeks. These bad boys are in shallow water no deeper than 8 ft. Most are being caught in 3 to 6 ft. of water. Most anglers are having good success using green weenies (salt/pepper w/chartreuse tail), gitzits (root beer or chartreuse), jigs (black or root beer), spinner baits (chartreuse or white). Some anglers are tempting the big bass with crank baits. Use broken back rebels (silver), shad rap balla's (silver/blue) or rattle traps (silver). some good spots to try are Neither Cove, Kelly Cove, all the coves in the Narrows, Oak Shores, Spanish Flat Coves, Pope Creek, Putah Creek, and the Big Island. I weighed in a very nice fish on Sat. March 4. This fish was caught by Dan Mason of Rodeo on a silver broken back rebel. It weighed in at 12.3 lbs. This is the biggest large mouth that I've weighed, in the past 2 years. Dan said that he caught it on the west shore, where, I don't know! Also, he did release this beautiful female back in the same area he caught her! The small mouth are still hitting off the rocky points in a little deeper water. Try 6 to 10 ft. using spinner baits (chartreuse), gitzits (root beer), or some smaller sized crank baits. The best spots to try are the Narrows, the Big Island, and Watermelon Island. I saw a nice 3 1/4 lb. smally come out of Capell Cove over the weekend.

The catfishing is still pretty good in the coves using chicken liver, night crawlers, clams, or dead minnows. The fat cats are mostly hanging in shallow water although some are being caught down to 20 ft. The hot spots are Spanish Flat Launch Ramp Cove, Capell Cove, Oak Shores, and Pope Creek.

Some trout are starting to show for trollers using flashers and a threaded minnow. Your best bet is to find the clear water and fish it. The water is pretty clear in the Narrows, Skiers Cove, and the mouth of the Narrows. Also, try silver lures such as kastmaster, phoebe, or triple teaser.

A few crappie were caught in Big Portuguese Cove over the weekend. Minnows were the bait and re/white mini-jigs were lures to try. Besides Portuguese try Putah Creek or Capell Cove.

Bass, trout, crappie and catfish were caught over the weekend both by shore anglers and boat anglers.

Bass were caught on crankbaits, spinner-baits and plastic worms and averaged from 1 1/2 - 2 1/4 lb.

Trout was caught by boat anglers trolling with needlefish lures by the dam area. Shore anglers were using minnows under a bobber from 3-5 ft. down. The trout caught varied from 15" to 18".

Some nice crappie were caught from shore 6' down using minnows and jigs.

Catfish still caught in the ends of most coves on night-crawlers, chicken-livers and clams.

SENIOR SENSE

This is the second in a series of quotes from an article titled *The Poor as First Victims of the Welfare State*, by noted Afro-American, Dr. Walter E. Williams, Associate Professor of Economics at Temple University in Philadelphia. Undated, some of the statistics mentioned herein are not current. For example, today's minimum wage is \$4.30 pr hour rather than the stated \$3.10. However, the *principles* expounded are timeless.

The article continues: "Black unemployment, particularly among its youth, is no less than a national scandal. Black youth unemployment today is nearly 40 percent. White youth unemployment is about 16 percent. This is common knowledge. Furthermore, if we were to include youths not working, not in school and not looking for work, both figures, black and white unemployment, would be considerably higher.

"What is not widely known or appreciated is that black youth unemployment and their low labor force participation rate is unprecedented in United States history. For example, in 1948 black and white youth unemployment in every age group was just about the same. In fact unemployment for blacks 16 to 18 years of age was less than that for whites in the same age group (9.2 percent compared to 10.4 percent). Furthermore, until 1954 blacks in every age group were more active in the labor market than their white counterparts. Today the labor force participation rate for blacks in every age group is less than that of whites. For some age groups the labor force participation rate is less than 50 percent of that of whites.

"How can we explain this dramatic reversal and deterioration of employment opportunities for black youth relative to white youth? Can we explain it by saying that today's businesses are more racially discriminatory in their hiring policy than those in 1948? Can we say that blacks, in 1948, had more education than whites did in 1948? There is no evidence that I know of that would even remotely support either contention. We cannot even blame the loss of black youth employment opportunities on the economic cycles. Labor statistics show that black youth unemployment rose both relatively and absolutely during periods of rapid economic expansion.

What does explain the bulk of the trend of deteriorating employment opportunities for black youths and to a lesser degree white youths? The minimum wage law and other labor laws can do a good job of explaining. The minimum wage law effectively discriminates against the employment of low skilled workers. We can see how it discriminates by putting ourselves in the place of an employer and asking the following question: If I must pay a minimum wage of \$3.10 per hour, does it pay me to employ a person who can produce only \$2.00 worth

of goods and services per hour? It turns out that to do so would be a losing economic proposition.

"Who are the low skilled? It turns out that youths in general are low skilled workers. They are low skilled (less valuable to the employer as workers) because they lack maturity and experience. Minority youths not only share this characteristic of youths in general, but they bear some of the burden of past discrimination and they for the most part attend grossly inferior schools. Therefore, if there is a law which discriminates against low skilled people, one would expect that minorities would be more adversely affected. The empirical evidence supports the economic prediction."

Among other wildflowers to come up in the spring here, are the Shooting Star, the Indian Warrior and the lovely patches of Maiden Hair Fern. The Buttermilk is also an early riser, which dot the waysides and the hills with their rich yellow "polka dots". The Shooting Star is an especially beautiful wild flower. It is a wild cyclamen and resembling a cluster of purple or rose colored "rockets", 8" to 10" high. They look so full of energy, beauty and lust for life as if the "rockets" were all ready to jump to the sky and join the stars!

The Indian Warriors stand in small companies in openings among the trees, the color a deep magenta with finely dissected leaves in greenish and bronzed colors to harmonize with the wine colored blossoms. The flower reminds you of a little of the Indian Paintbrush which appears later in the spring and is a "shirt tail" relative of it.

Very soon you will see the lupins come out. The



royal blue lupin, often growing in large fields, is one of the loveliest of California wildflowers. The plant itself is small, only about 12" tall, but what a beautiful sight when they cover a whole meadow or a slope in velvety blue! Often they stand close to a crowd of poppies, perfectly complimenting their fiery orange color.

New Teachers-In-Charge Named At Capell School

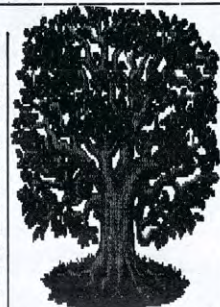
Principal Sharyn Lindsey named Sue Hall and Phyllis Mosher teachers-in-charge at Capell Valley School. Both primary teachers assumed their new responsibilities on March 1. The school's previous teacher-in-charge Mike Bolden stepped down voluntarily in mid-February to devote more of his time to the implementation of the school's technology grant from the state and to the development of classroom projects based on the grant.

In the administrative reorganization, intermediate teacher Mike Bolden will concentrate his efforts more fully on coordinating activities to implement the California State's Senate Bill 1510 Technology Grant. He will also spend more time developing classroom projects, such as a student-operated newspaper, a video news program, a bank and a stock market. Mrs. Hall and Mrs. Mosher will devote more of their time to administrative tasks.

To date, the \$4,200.00 in state grant money has been used to purchase four Macintosh

LCIII computers and software programs. The grant was awarded to Capell at the end of last year and is intended to help students become more computer literate, to network the school's eleven classroom computers and to help the school reach out to the Capell Valley community through student-centered projects. One such project is the submission of student-written and faculty-written news articles to *The Lake Berryessa News*. Full implementation of the Department of Education's grant is expected by June 1995.

Capell Valley School has been assigned a designated teacher-in-charge to better meet the administrative needs of the small site when Principal Sharyn Lindsey is not present. The teacher-in-charge assumes most administrative duties when Mrs. Lindsey is at Mt. George School, her other principalship site. Teacher-in-charge duties include the coordination of school maintenance and emergency procedures and discipline policies. Napa Valley Unified School District issues a small stipend to its teachers-in-charge throughout Napa County.



Capell Sixth Graders Plan To Hike Mendocino Redwoods

Capell School's nine sixth graders will join seventy other sixth graders from other schools on a trip to Mendocino Woodlands Camp to learn about nature and cooperation for five days in May. From May 8th through May 12th, the sixth graders of Capell, Mount George and Yountville Schools are going on an outdoor education program in the Mendocino redwoods. They will be learning about what mother nature is and how she can be protected and safely used.

On the first day, there will be a tour of the camp and after that students will be shown to

camp stuff. The kids will be sleeping in rustic, open-air cabins, and of course, the boys and girls will not be sleeping in the same cabins. Boys and girls will be kept in separate areas of the camp at night.

The cabins in which the students will live for the week are about 15 feet by 15 feet. There are no bunk beds but four individual cots and four locker-like closets. The cabins have six to eight windows that make it cold because screens are the only window covering.

The students' week at outdoor education will start each day with a wake-up call at 7:00 a.m. and breakfast at 7:30. After breakfast, the kids will help clean the dining hall and the kitchen.

Then the kids will prepare and pack their lunches and get ready to go hiking on wilderness trails throughout the redwood forests of Mendocino. Hikes will last as long as five hours. During one of their trips, they will be visiting the tide pools along the coast.

The sixth graders of Capell will be paying for their trip by selling snacks, like nachos for \$1.00, drinks for \$1.00 and other goodies for \$.25 to \$.50. The snack bar is their cabins. There will be a campfire on the first day and the last day of camp where students will sing camp songs and do other

Since there are seventy more sixth graders than the nine that go to Capell, Mr. Bolden, the sixth graders' teacher, is going to try to put friends together in cabins so everybody will be happy and not too homesick.

An Editorial: Mountain Lions Prowl Capell

Over the past few years mountain lion sightings have become more regular in and around Capell Valley School. Local residents have lost livestock, have had lions cross their yards, and have had lions try to steal downed game. If you understand the behavior of these animals and know that they are protected by the Fish and Game Department, you will realize that people will continue to meet up with mountain lions.

The average citizen needs to make up his or her mind: either decrease the lion population or continue to worry about your children, pets and

The bass is any of several percid, or perchlike, fish, including some important food fish and some of the most popular game species. Most bass are members of three related families: Serranidae, or sea bass, including GROUPERS; Percichthyidae, or temperate bass; and Centrarchidae, or SUNFISH, including the CRAPPIE and some bream. The first two families are primarily marine shore fish distributed worldwide in tropical and temperate seas, but a few species are found in brackish or fresh water; together they number more than 400 species. The Centrarchidae, about 30 species, are freshwater fish of temperate North America.

Bass are spiny-finned fish with generalized, laterally compressed bodies and usually only slightly forked tail fins. They range in size from the giant sea bass, *Stereolepis gigas*, a temperate bass of the Pacific coast of North America that reaches lengths of 2.1 m (7 ft) and weights of more than 250 kg (550 lb), to sea bass species that reach lengths of no more than 10 cm (4 in). The majority of bass are carnivorous.

Among common sea bass of North America are the Pacific coast's kelp bass, *Paralabrax clathratus*; the barred sand bass, *nebulifer*, and the spotted sand bass, *maculatofasciatus*. On the Atlantic coast the black sea bass, *Centropomus striata*, is a popular game fish.

Several temperate bass, including the giant sea bass, are important game fish as well. The most desirable species, the striped bass, *Morone saxatilis*, can weigh more than 45 kg (100 lb). It is native to the Atlantic coast

and was introduced to the California coast in the late 19th century. Two smaller freshwater relatives, the white bass, *chrysops*, and the yellow bass, *mississippiensis*, are native to eastern North America.

Probably the best-known bass to North American freshwater anglers are the various sunfish species of the genus *Micropterus*. The largemouth bass, *salmoides*, occurs naturally in eastern North America but has been introduced throughout the rest of the continent. It is one of the most popular of all freshwater game fish; the angling record is 10 kg (22.25 lb). The smallmouth bass, *dolomieu*, is a more northern species that prefers cooler waters and grows to about half the size of the largemouth. Another common species is the spotted bass, *punctulatus*, found from Ohio to Florida and westward into Kansas and Texas; it grows to about 1.8 kg (4 lb). The Guadalupe bass, *treculi*, is found only in the Guadalupe River drainage basin in Texas; the Suwannee bass, *notius*, is restricted to northern Flor-

ida; and the redeye bass, *coosae*, is restricted to the Alabama River drainage basin. None of these last three species reaches more than 0.9 kg (2 lb).

The white sea bass, *Cynoscion nobilis*, of California is actually a drum, family *Sciaenidae*.

Bass are popular North American food and game fish. The largemouth bass, *salmoides*, which can weigh up to 10kg (22.25 lb).

The striped bass, *saxatilis*, can weigh up to 45kg (100 lb) and is one of the most desirable species of freshwater game fish
