



Moskowite Corners For Sale


Visitors and residents know the intersection of Highways 121 and 128 as Moskowite Corners, or simply "The Corners." The property was recently listed for sale for \$1.29 million.

Jim Keller bought the property in a bankruptcy sale for \$1.1 million in 2008. Over the past several years, Keller spent more than \$400,000 on improvements, including a bar addition, new deck, equipment, electrical and plumbing work.

The business center is now known as "The Crossroads at Berryessa". In August 2010, Jim Winchell and his family took over the market, restaurant and bar. Winchell said his business has been growing in the year they've managed it, with new customers coming in every week.

Although the Winchells are not in a position to buy the property themselves, several local residents speculate that it might be a good investment for the Pensus Group as Pensus renovates the six resort concessions they now own. Anyone going almost anywhere at Lake Berryessa has to pass it.







Real Berryessa Valley History from Murray Clark


My Grandfather, Alonzo Clark lost his right arm in a bird hunting accident when he was about 19 years old. That would have been about 1867. Dad said Grandpa always wore a suit no matter what he was doing. He said Grandpa could pick up a sack of wheat with his left hand. A sack of wheat could weigh between 130 - 145 pounds. One day Grandpa had been out in the field and it was pouring down rain. He came to the house, put his horse away and went to the bunkhouse to dry off before going to the ranch house. The bunkhouse had a huge fireplace in it. When he walked in there were several hired hands around the fire. No one offered to make room for him so he reached into his pocket and threw a hand full of rifle ammunition into the fire. Dad said when they started exploding guys were going out the doors and windows. Grandpa just stood there until he was warm and dry.

Dad used to haul wheat from Berryessa to Napa with a 6-horse team and wagon. There was still one of these freight wagons on the ranch when I was a young man. They were huge, about 4 feet wide and 14 to 16 feet long. The sides had to be 5 to 6 feet tall. Of course, the driver's seat was on top and up front. I remember playing on this old wagon when I was a small boy. The rear wheels were 6 feet in diameter. They were also equipped with brakes.

The trip was about 35 miles and took 3 days because of the mountainous terrain. The first day was from Monticello to Windy Flats. Windy Flats was like a stage stop for the teamsters. They would spend the night, get something to eat, rest and feed the teams. Then it was on to Napa to unload and go back as far as Windy Flats again. The next day back to Monticello. One time Dad was on his way back to the flats with an empty wagon.

When they were empty they usually only hitched two mules to the wagon and led the other four behind the wagon. The reason they only hitched two mules is that it is much easier to negotiate the turns. Dad had just topped the mountain and was headed down the other side when he met a guy on a bicycle. Well these mules had never seen a bicycle before and it scared the hell out of them.

The road is narrow and traverses a very steep bill side, 60 degrees off the down hill side of the road. The mules went over the down hill side and Dad jumped from the top of the wagon as it was going over. The four mules behind the wagon pulled loose and were OK. The two that went over the edge were killed. The wagon tumbled down the hill about 100 yards and came to rest against a big tree. One time on our way to Napa, Dad and Mom stopped and pointed out the wagon to me. In the early 1950's there was a big fire in the country and what was left of the wagon burned up.




Rehabilitation of North End Trail at Lake Berryessa


The rehabilitation and realignment of the North End Trail is a joint effort by the Bureau of Reclamation and Berryessa Trails & Conservation. The existing North End Trail was established in the late 1970s and has a number of safety and environmental issues as a result of its current condition, alignment, and ongoing erosion along the banks of the reservoir. Segments of the trail are in close proximity to, and in some cases on the edge of, eroding cliffs or landslides.

The proposed action consists of rehabilitating the existing trail by realigning portions away from hazardous areas, resurfacing the trail through the use of possible trail stabilizers, and removing and controlling overgrown vegetation. Associated structures, such as trailheads, gates, bridges, and wet crossings, would also be constructed or repaired, as needed.

The new North End Trail would be approximately the same length as the existing trail (7.3 miles long), but would include new loop and access trails and would adhere to sustainable design techniques. The trail would follow the same alignment in most areas, but would be shifted further inland in areas where erosion or landslides have created hazardous conditions along the shore of the lake. It would consist of a 4-foot-wide mineral soil surface trail with 2 feet of clearance on both sides (8-foot-wide by 8-foot-high corridor free of vegetation).

The modified trail would consist of 5.4 miles of main trail, 1.1 miles of loop trails, 0.5 mile of access trails, and less than 0.5 mile of existing trail that requires regrading. Six loop trails would be created, with access to the main trail at eight points along the trail.




