SEAL OF APPROVAL

Chris had just touched bottom at forty feet when the silvery shape slid through his bubble trail and tapped the back of his wetsuit hood. His whole body jerked in surprise. I knew he hoped it was only a trick I was playing on him from above. But then he saw the form flash into a 180 degree turn and shoot straight toward his facemask. And he realized it was

The water off Santa Rosa Island was warm that August day. An unusual thermocline at twenty-five feet separated water temperatures different by at least fifteen degrees. The boundary layer scintillated before our eyes. We pierced that temperature barrier several times during the next half hour since the silver shape, and a companion brown one, really did want to play. We had teamed up with a couple of friendly seals.

Our third and last day of diving off the Santa Barbara Channel Islands started with the great smells and sounds of morning on the ocean, including the always memorable change from warm clothes to still-damp wetsuit. We had seen seals on this trip and had played hide and seek in the kelp with some. But these two wanted to get up close and personal. The brown one chose me and glided slowly toward where I floated. He looked amused as I touched him with my outstretched hand. I stroked towards his tail and felt his sleek, soft outer layer. When I rubbed the other way a stiff bristle-brush resistance stopped my

Rock outcroppings, with many ledges and small canyons, rose around us to the surface perfect for a game of tag. Our friends would swim off, wait for us to chase them, then dart into a canyon and disappear around a rock. Once I floated twenty feet above Chris as he searched for his seal. The seal was swimming right above and behind his head. I could swear he was giggling - the seal, that is! The seal would sneak up, bite at some wisps of hair floating from under Chris' hood, and the chase was on again.

My seal and I performed head-on fly-bys and chased each other across the bottom, with me doing my best to be smooth and seal-like. But I must have looked like a blue, bubbling epileptic fit to my friend. We twisted, turned, swam upside down, did somersaults. Never did I envy the easy freedom of motion of a seal more. But never did I have quite as much three-dimensional weightless fun! We touched each other quite a bit as we rested between flurries of canyon gliding hide-and-seek. Chris' silver friend was not quite as chummy, but they played fast and happy the whole time. Enjoying the underwater world with another warm-blooded air-breather is incredible enough. Sharing it with your own child

Air never lasts long enough, but this dive would have ended too soon no matter how long it lasted. We'd been watching our gauges jealously, trying to be totally involved in our experience every second. Time was defined by air pressure, and, too soon, time was up. We all felt the beginning of a sense of loss as we slowed our play. It was that awkward moment of not knowing what to say when you realize that something special is over.

Humans tend to over-anthropomorphize other animals. But I felt we were the ones being seal-omorphized that day - large ungainly creatures, suffering from some unknown physical disability, swimming hard, sympathetically accepted for our efforts, maybe kind of cute in our own way.

Chris patted his seal goodbye and headed for the surface. I stood, barely touching bottom, holding both hands out in front of me. My new friend flicked his tail and glided toward my face, large dark eyes staring into mine. My hands circled his neck as he slid forward and pressed his nose to my facemask. Then he wrapped his flippers around my hands -I could feel his bones pressing on mine. I don't know how long we floated, weightless, staring, thinking, feeling. Finally we let go of each other and both headed for home. Neither of us could look back.



Lake Berrvessa's Old Boy Scout Camp Reborn as EcoCamp Berryessa

EcoCamp Berryessa is a 64-bed group environmental education camp located on the peaceful northern shoreline of Lake Berryessa. The camp, which was completed in 2015 and funded through a major grant from the State Coastal Conservancy, features solar power, showers feeding into a graywater system, environmentally friendly composting toilets, permanent tent cabins, a stone amphitheater, a canoe/kayak launch, a beach, and countless paths and trails connecting the visitor to the beauty of Lake Berryessa, which surrounds the camp on three sides. In keeping with its name, EcoCamp Berryessa was designed with an eye to energy-efficiency, use of natural and/or recycled materials, and resource conservation.



The camp is located just north of the Putah Creek Bridge. Approximately 10 acres, the site is characterized by blue oak woodlands, open grassland, and chamise. Several pair of osprey nest at or near the camp and it is not unusual to see bald eagles, river otter, and a resident grey fox. The camp is available to scouting, educational, and community organizations for group gatherings and outdoor events.

EcoCamp Berryessa will be home to the Napa Open Space District's outdoor education program, currently being developed with their partners at Trackers Earth. Trackers offers camps and outdoor programs for all ages with subject matter including outdoor skills, knowledge of local flora, habitat restoration, archery, canoeing, and many more.

Schools, organizations, and corporate groups can plan trips ranging from single day field trips or 1 - 4 night overnight excursions at Camp Berryessa. Lake Berryessa Watershed Partnership 2016 Program Summary

The Lake Berryessa Boater Outreach (LBBO) program focused on educational outreach and invasive species prevention at Lake Berryessa, which provides drinking water for more than 500,000 Solano County residents. Throughout the season, LBBO interns administered watercraft screenings for invasive zebra and quagga mussels and conducted interactive, educational surveys with boaters and recreational users.

The primary goal of the LBBO program is to prevent the introduction and spread of invasive zebra and quagga mussels into Lake Berryessa. Interns accomplished this by verbally and visually screening incoming boats. They staffed the busiest boat launches, including Markley Cove and Steele Canyon, seven days a week to maximize the scope of the program. By screening more boats, they were able to educate more boaters about the potential harm of invasive mussels and how to avoid transporting these "aquatic hitchhikers" between waterways.

Governmentium: A New Addition to Chemistry's Periodic Table

Research has led to the discovery of the heaviest element yet known to science. The new element, Governmentium (Gv), has one neutron, 25 assistant neutrons, 88 deputy neutrons, and 198 assistant deputy neutrons, giving it an atomic mass of These 312 particles are held together by forces called morons, which are


Governmentium has no electrons, it is inert; however, it can be detected, because
