

Daylight Saving Time

At 2 a.m. on March 11, groggy Americans will turn their clocks forward one hour, marking the beginning of Daylight Saving Time (DST). In Aug. 2005, Congress passed an energy bill that included extending Daylight Saving Time by about a month. Beginning in 2007, DST will start the second Sunday of March and end on the first Sunday of November.

> The new law may save millions of gallons of oil, but there's a potential problem in any software that was programmed before the new law was enacted in 2005. Software created earlier is set to automatically advance its timekeeping by one hour on the first Sunday in April, not the second Sunday in March (that's March 11 this year).

The result is a glitch reminiscent of the Y2K bug, when cataclysmic crashes were feared if computers interpreted the year 2000 as 1900 and couldn't reconcile time appearing to move backward. This bug is much less threatening, but it could cause head-scratching episodes when some computers are an hour off. Softwre companies have been sendig out fixes. Did you get yours?

JOE PRIDMORE Wins National Cutting Horse Association World Finals in the \$10,000 Amateur Class - Also Qualifies for Rookie of the Year!

At the young age of 16, Joe Pridmore is No. 1 in the world in the National Cutting Horse Association \$10,000 Amateur Class - and he's been cutting for only three years. The Napa High junior is the son of Gil & Kathy Pridmore of Capell Valley.

Joe started cutting almost by accident. His sister, Cori, knew cutting horse trainers, Jason and Dana Haefner, of American Canyon and Joe started helping out around their ranch. The first time on a cutting horse was so much fun that he was hooked.

The challenge of a cutter is to select a single calf from the herd while on their horse, then gently guide the calf into the center of the arena. The cutting duo then prevent the calf from ducking past them and escaping back to the herd. It's a 50/50 partnership where the rider relies on the intelligence and skill of his horse, but also has to be able



to read the cow and understand where it and his horse are going. Joe has become a very skilled rider with the balance and strength to work with his horse in those quick tight turns that are so exciting to spectators. And he said he really doesn't feel his guts bouncing around inside him the way it looks

to us from the outside!

2006 was a good year for Joe and Harley. They won both the Pacific Coast Cutting Horse Association \$10,000 Amateur Champion and Rookie of the Year Champion saddles and were third in the PCCHA 2000 Limit Rider. The duo started 2007 with a win in the \$50,000 Amateur Circuit Champions at San Diego. He competed in 34 shows. Ask Gil and Kathy about how they cope with those logistics it's quite a story. He's traveled to Arizona, Nevada, Oregon, Oklahoma and Texas and would travel more, but maintaining his GPA is a high priority.

Cutting is Joe's favorite sport but he enjoys playing water polo for the Napa High Indians, as well as swim meets. He hopes to continue with all three sports once he graduates in 2008, including water polo at the collegiate level.

America's Biggest Bike Race Rides by Berryessa

144 elite, international cyclists that included Olympic medalists and world champions passed by Lake Berryessa while participating in the second annual Amgen Tour of California Bike Race. The 156 mile stage of race brought racers from Santa Rosa through Napa to Sacramento.

The 8-day race continued to attract record crowds, besting its own record of 1.3 million fans last year, and shoring its place as the most attended cycling race in the U.S. "In only its second year the Amgen Tour of California con-

Hundreds of spectators lined the route around Lake Berryessa to cheer on the competitors. Locals got a quick look as riders flew past Turtle Rock at speeds upwards of 50 MPH, and the parking lot was packed at The Corners where another large group of people converged to see the race. However the real action was

at the top of the climb out of Wragg Canyon on 128, west of the dam. Hundreds more die hard fans cheered on the racers as they road a timed incline section called the King Of the Mountain (KOM).


"This was a really beautiful stage today, and there were so many cheering fans out watching the race in every small town and village... it felt like I was in the Tour de France!," said Christoph Laurent of France. Laurent, one of the 3 breakaway racers ahead of the Peloton, or main pack, ended up winning both KOM challenges of the day.

California. His total time to complete the 700 mile race was 24 hours, 57 minutes and 24 seconds. A resident of Santa Rosa, Calif., Leipheimer is the second consecutive Californian to win the title.

The 8-day race continued to attract record crowds, besting its own record of 1.3 million fans last year, and shoring its place as the most attended cycling race in the U.S. "In only its second year, the Amgen Tour of California continues to grow as the largest cycling event in America, and we've been proud to host the best field of cyclists ever to race on U.S. soil," said Shawn Hunter, president of AEG Sports, presenters of the race

When the race hit Winters and the winds in the Sacramento Valley, the Peloton caught up to the breakaway where Levi Leipheimer of team Discovery Channel Pro took the lead and eventually won the race, retained his Amgen Leader Jersey.

"The Amgen Tour of California showcases the state in the best possible way. We have riders racing from San Francisco to Long Beach. We have the most beautiful places in the world," declared Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger on the victory stage after the race, where he helped present leader jerseys. "We're going to do this year, after year, after year because this is a great event."

After eight days of leading, Discovery Channel Pro Cycling Team's Levi Leipheimer (USA) was crowned as champion of the 2007 Amgen Tour of





Lake Berryessa: The First 50 Years and Next Summer

Janet Rogers, the new Park Manager for the Bureau of Reclamation at Lake Berryessa, is a 20 year National Park Service veteran who comes to the lake with a positive vision for its future. She started at Yosemite and worked her way through postings at Kings Canyon, the Grand Canyon, Lake Roosevelt, and lastly at Haleakala, Hawaii. Having experienced that much natural beauty, Janet still acknowledges the unique attraction of the Lake Berryessa view and the lake's recreational potential.

Janet gets here just in time for the 50th anniversary of the construction of Monticello Dam. Several agencies and groups are planning events for the summer and fall, culminating with big celebrations in Fairfield and Lake Solano Park in October. All the resorts and local businesses and residents will be contacted to participate in these Golden Anniversary celebrations. There will be articles and events emphasizing the history of the lake and social and other changes brought about by the creation of Monticello Dam.

But there are other major changes coming to Lake Berryessa this summer.

One is the attempt to control the party at the Pope Creek Bridge. Although the summer weekend gathering of hundreds of boats under the bridge has been a lake tradition for decades, the accompanying rowdiness of the people on shore has become more of a law enforcement problem during the last few years. In an attempt to change the reputation of the lake and entice more families to recreate here, the Pope Creek Bridge will be off-limits to all motorized watercraft during the three major holiday weekends this summer, beginning with the Memorial Day weekend. A string of booms will be placed across the entrance to Pope Creek and only kayaks, canoes, and inflatables with no motors will be allowed access. Even electric trolling motors will be banned. The parking lot at the bridge will be open during the day, but closed at night.

Rumors that the jumping rock will be blown up were way off base. In an initial attempt to keep rock jumpers from being injured or killed, the BOR will install signs warning of the danger and discouraging people from Her boyfriend asks, "What is it supposed to be when it's finished?" climbing onto the rock.

Another major change will be implementing the BOR Record of Decision's requirement to make the Big Island Lagoon a non-motorized zone - except for electric trolling motors. Reclamation hopes to have the required signage and buoys in place by Memorial Day weekend. This will be a permanent year-around change into the future, so the families and other visitors with houseboats and ski boats who used to use it as a refuge from the open water will have to find someplace else to rest.

Karen Wagner, the new Deputy Park Manager, points out that the positive aspect of this change is to encourage more kayakers and canoeists to visit the lake. Karen emphasized that Oak Shores Park has been upgraded with new sun shelters and has a launch ramp for non-motorized watercraft. There's a new brochure describing the Smittle Creek trail. Another upgrade meant to attract visitors and educate them about the lake is the remodeling of the BOR Visitors Center. The remodel is nearly complete and new educational displays will soon be installed. Guest displays will be encouraged.

Janet and Karen are also quite excited about the prospects for refurbishing Camp Berryessa as an environmental education center and family/group camping facility. They and other local community groups and public agencies are investigating possible funding sources to see if this great resource can be upgraded in phases so that the public may be able to enjoy it soon-

On another note, Dan Colda has replaced the late Cleave Dufer as Concessions Management Specialist. Dan is assisted by Patty Blackwell, Concessions Specialist, and Lynne Matthias, Concessions Specialist.

Bureau of Reclamation Releases 50th Annivrsary Plans to Raise Monticello Dam

BOR officials announced that, after decades of rumors, Monticello Dam will finally be raised 10 feet as part of their redevelopment plan for Lake Berryessa. Although the rising lake level will help in removing trailers from the seven resorts by floating them away, this is not the primary goal of the plan. Napa County signed away most of its water rights to the lake and now Solano County is being pressured by Budweiser to supply more water to its brewery.

To protect sensitive wildlife habitat (and some private property), the BOR will build a 15 foot tall dike around the shoreline. The Sierra Club, which originally agreed to help fund a 165 mile trail around the lake, agrees that the dike should be the trail: a win-win multi-use solution.

Per Congressman Mike Thompson, since it will be funded at taxpayer expense, the dike will be wide enough for hikers, bikers, horses, mortocycles and ATV's to share. Special launch ramps will be built at the resorts for high water access. Several "put-ins" for kayaks will be spaced around the lake with the newlydesigned "Kayak Katapults" for rapid launching of non-motorized watercraft.

Although the Big Island Lagoon will become a non-motorized area beginning this summer, LakeBerryessaHistoryBuffs.com will present several historical re-enactments of hydroplane races and water ski competitions through the Big Island Lagoon as part of the 50th Anniversary celebrations later during the summer.

What's Inside: Squirt-On Cheese It's perfect on a cracker, almost too perfect. Explore the secrets of one of the world's most unnatural foods.

- Whey: The cheese-making process removes 80 to 90 percent of milk's moisture, some of which is in the form of liquidy whey proteins. This byproduct is usually thrown out, but Kraft plows it back into Easy Cheese to increase volume (filler!) – and passes the savings along to you.
- Canola oil: Keeps the cheese from solidifying.

- Calcium phosphate: Sodium phosphate tends to make calcium unavailable to the body. So it's possible that calcium phosphate has to be added to make Easy Cheese healthier. It also makes it legal for Kraft to label every can "an excellent source of calcium."
- · Lactic acid: Bacteria, either found naturally in milk or added in the cheesemaking process, digest the milk sugar lactose and produce lactic acid. It tastes a little sour, because that's how your taste buds interpret hydrogen ions, a key component of every acid.



With surface temperatures close to 50 degrees, the bass bite for smallies is hot. Hit the narrows and coves with your favorite plastics. Troll Needlefish behind a flasher in 5 to 10 feet for trout. The skier's cove shoreline is best. Troll in 8 feet of water on Skiers Cove shoreline and you land 1 to 1.5 lb. Trout. Soak minnows or tiny jigs for crappie early in the morning.

What is ALS

(Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis) is a disorder that affects the function of nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord. Motor neurons reach from the brain to the spinal cord and from the spinal cord to the muscles throughout the body. The progressive degeneration of the motor neurons in ALS eventually leads to their death. When the motor neurons die, the ability of the brain to initiate and control muscle movement is lost. With voluntary muscle action progressively affected, patients in the later stages of the disease may become totally paralyzed. 
